

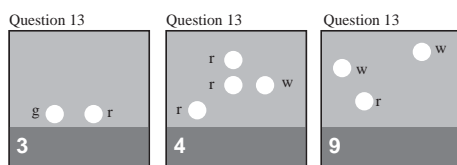
Errata Sheet - Powerboating Workbook

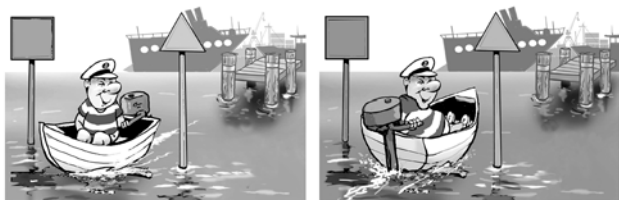

- Page 7 Fig 7.3 - add the 'd' in deadman lanyard.
- Page 14 Spring lines. First sentence should read - A spring line is a pivot line used in docking, undocking, or to prevent the boat from moving forward or stern while made fast to a dock. See page 64.
- Page 15 The glossary is on pages 90 - 91.
- Page 16 Figure 16.2, delete bottom arrow in alternative 15 so only one arrow points to the chine.
- Page 33 Q2. In the situation, correct spelling of word *their* to *there* - "there are large puffy clouds above the black sky."
- Page 35 Q4. Second line, a better question would be for the leading lights (a) In the centre of the channel.
Q6. Better sentence - Where is a sectored light and what parts can be seen from which parts of the arc?
Q10. Your starting point is 25°49'S, 153°05'E.
- Page 38 Q4. A line is missing below 5-10 knots.
Q5a. The sentence should read - Between which latitudes are the tightest pressure gradients found?
- Page 46 Q4. You cannot describe a position by latitude alone, so add the longitude of 153°06'E
- Page 46 Should read - Now study the chart on page 34 and the inside back cover and answer the questions below.
Q1. Asks difference between T2,T4 and T5. It should read T2, T4 and T6.
- Page 49 Day shape for fishing vessel on left (basket) shows same day shape as vessel on right. Delete the inverted triangles in the left illustration.
- Page 51 Q13.3. - swap the red and green lights around as shown below.
Q13.4. - add a white light as shown below.
Q13.9. - the left hand white light should be lower than the right hand white light as shown below.



- Page 64 Illustration - how to tie to bollard is actually demonstrating how to "dip the eye" of a berthing line when another vessel is using the bollard.
- Page 86 In the second scenario, licence is spelt with a "c".
- Page 89 In the competency test, Q32, alternative (c) should read the soundings range from 1 - 29 metres, not 12 - 25 metres.
- Inside cover Bottom centre two cartoons of man driving boat into and out of port. Ignore the direction of buoyage arrow as it may be confused with direction of travel.



Planned changes for Version 2006.2

- Reduce the number of incorrect question responses in competency test.
- Remove buoyage arrows from cartoons (as above).
